Part 1 A. Listening and Speaking Skills - Blend words

- 1. Open up the programme.
- 2. Component will auto run.
- 3. Parents please view the whole component first,
- 4. It is divided into 1) Word blend 2) Reader text
 - 3) Reader sentences 4) Comprehension 5)Songs
- 5. Forward your programme to the blend sounds of long vowel 'u'

Working with your child: Learning to blend long vowel sound 'u'

- 6. Look and listen to the introduction of words with sound 'u-e'. PAUSE
- 7. Replay this page with child trying to sound alongside.
- 8. Pause the page and tell your child to try and sound the words.
- 9. Tell your child to point and sound the letters and say the word.
- 10. Look and listen to the introduction of words with sound 'u-e'. PAUSE
- 11. Replay this page with child trying to sound alongside.
- 12. Pause the page and tell your child to try and sound the words.
- 13. Tell your child to point and sound the letters and say the word.
- 14. Look and listen to the introduction of words with sound 'ew'. PAUSE
- 15. Replay this page with child trying to sound alongside.
- 16. Pause the page and tell your child to try and sound the words.
- 17. Tell your child to point and sound the letters and say the word.

Suggested Activities:

Activity 1.

- 1. Write out the letter sound one at a time.
- 2. Tell your child to give you words related to the sound.
- 3. Sound out the letters when he/she say the word Activity 2.
- 1. Give the sound of each word and tell your child to write it down.



Part 2

B. Listening and Speaking Skills - Reading text

- 1. Forward the programme to the page of the book with sentences
- 2. Tell your child to look and listen to the sentences.
- 3. Run the page twice.
- 4. Run the page again but turn off the sound.
- 5. Tell your child to read as the words change colour.
- 6. Than rerun and cover the picture and tell your child to say the word as recognized.
- 7. Praise your child for every word said correctly.
- 8. The final round tell your child to point to the words and read.
- 9. Do this for all the sentences in the book picture.
- 10. Now rewind the programme backward to the picture with the full text.
- 11. Tell your child to attempt to read with you prompting along.
- 12. Carry out skill activities with your child.
 - 1. Look at the word blend in the text. Tell your child to blend the letters and say.
 - 2. Identify words that your child can already read.
 - 3. Write words at random and ask your child to read.
- 13. Forward the programme to the part with question and answers
- 14. Pause at the first question.
- 15. Ask your child for the answer.
- 16. Check by playing the programme again.
- 17. Ensure that your child answer in a full text.
- 18. Continue the same method for all 3 questions.

C. Listening and Writing Skills.

- 1. Refer Mikids Text book L2 Page 30 Ask your School principal for a page copy if your child don't have the book.
- 2. Follow the instructions and do accordingly.


